### **SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

### 1 RULES

1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).

### NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

- 2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the Official Notice Board, situated in the Club House
- 2.2 A Competitors Briefing will be held at 1230hrs on Thurs 24 August in the Clubhouse. Subsequent briefings may be held and will be advised on the Official Notice Board.

### 3 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Any changes to the Sailing Instructions (SIs) will be posted for at least two hours before the scheduled start time of the race or races concerned; except that any change to the schedule of races shall be posted by 2000hrs on the day before it will take effect.

### 4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the flagpole situated Prestwick Sailing Club clubhouse.
- 4.2 Boats shall not go afloat until released. Release will be notified by flying IC flag 'R'.
- 4.3 When IC flag 'AP' is displayed ashore, '1 minute', in 'Race Signals' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes'. This changes the meaning of AP in RRS Race Signals.

### 5 SCHEDULE OF RACES

5.2 One extra race per day may be sailed, provided that the class becomes no more than one race ahead of schedule, and the change is made in accordance with SI 3.1. No more than 4 races will be sailed in any one day.

- 5.3 The warning signal for the first scheduled race on Thurs 24 Aug will be at 1355hrs. The warning signal for the first scheduled race on Friday 25 Aug and Sat 26 Aug will be 1155hrs. The warning signal for the first scheduled race on Sun 27 Aug will be at 1055hrs.
- 5.4 No warning signal will be made after 1500hrs on the last day of racing.
- 5.5 In the event of a race being recalled, restarted, re-sailed or abandoned the next race sailed will be that race with subsequence races being sailed thereafter in their scheduled order.

### 6 CLASS FLAGS

6.1 The class flag will be light blue rectangle with RS300 in black writing.

### 7 RACING AREA

7.1 The racing area will be the waters adjacent to Prestwick Sailing Club.

## 8 THE COURSES

- 8.1 The diagrams in Appendix A show the courses, including the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.
- 8.2 The course A, B, C or D with the number of laps to be sailed will be indicated on the committee boat for each race. This will be notified by displaying the appropriate IC flag for the course and the appropriate numeral pennant for the laps. This also may be written on the notice board on the committee boat.
- 8.3 The approximate bearing of the windward mark may be displayed on the committee boat notice board prior to the warning signal.

### 9 MARKS

9.1 The course marks are described in Appendix A of these SIs.

### 10 THE START

- 10.1 The starting line will be between a mast displaying an orange flag on the committee boat at the starboard end and the port-end starting mark.
- 10.2 When an inner limit mark is laid near or downwind of the committee boat it is a starting limit mark and shall be left to starboard when starting. No boat may pass between the limit mark and the committee boat.
- 10.3 A boat starting later than 5 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A4.1 & A5.

### 11 MINIMUM WIND STRENGTH

11.1 Races will not be started unless the Race Officer is satisfied that the wind strength over the whole of the course is in excess of 4 knots.

### 12 CHANGE OF NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

12.1 To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will lay a new mark (or move the finish line) and remove the original mark as soon as practicable. When in a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by the original mark.

### 13 SHORTENING COURSES

- On all courses if required a race may be shortened at any mark of the course in accordance with RRS 32.2. All competitors shall complete the number of rounds equal to the leading boat before proceeding to the finish.
- 13.2 When IC flag W is displayed, boats that have not yet finished may be given a finishing place anywhere on the race course or at a nearby mark, or not. Boats can finish between the adjacent mark and the committee or support vessel displaying IC flag W. When a boat finishes in accordance with this instruction, she shall be awarded a finishing place after all boats that have passed the nearby mark ahead of her before IC flag W was displayed. Boats that have already passed the mark before IC flag W is displayed shall continue and finish as described in the course in Appendix A. This changes RRS 32.2.

### 14 THE FINISH

14.1 The finish line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag on the committee boat and the finishing mark.

### 15 PENALTY SYSTEM

15.1 Boats may touch a mark other than the starting or finishing mark. A boat shall not manhandle a mark when it results in an advantage. This changes RRS 31

### 16 TIME LIMITS

16.1 The time limit shall be 90 minutes from the valid start for the first boat that sails the course and finishes. If one boat finishes within that limit then the time limit will be amended to 20 minutes after the finishing time of the first boat. Boats failing to finish within the amended time limit shall be scored in their observed positions on the course. This changes RRS 35, A4 and A5. Boats finished in this way will be advised of the fact by a safety boat and should stop racing thereafter.

### 17 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 17.1 Protest forms will be available from the Race Office. They shall be delivered there within the protest time limit.
- 17.2 The protest time limit is 90 minutes after the last boat has finished the last race of the day or the race committee signals no more racing today, whichever is later
- 17.3 Notices will be posted within 30 minutes of the expiry of the protest time to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties to, or named as witnesses. It shall be the responsibility of competitors to check the notice board for such notices, obtain their copy of the protest form and make sure that they and their witnesses attend the hearing.

- 17.4 Where a Class judge a NJ, IJ or official arbitrator is appointed to an event the Exoneration Penalty and the Advisory Hearing and RYA Arbitration procedures of the RYA Rules Disputes Procedures will be available. See official notice board for details.
- 17.5 For infringements of the rules other than in Parts 1 and 2 of the RRS, the protest committee may award a lesser penalty than disqualification.
- 17.6 Breaches of instructions 19.2, 22.1, 22.2 and 26 will not be grounds for a protest by a boat. This changes rule 60.1(a).

### 18 SCORING SYSTEM

- 18.1 Points will accrue to the helm named on the entry form and not the boat entered
- 18.2 (a) Three races are required to be completed to constitute the series.
  - (b) When fewer than 4 races have been completed, a competitor's series score will be the total of her race scores.
  - (c) When from 4 -7 races have been completed, a competitor's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
  - (d) When 8 or more races have been completed, a competitor's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.
- 18.3 To request correction of an alleged error in posted race or series results, a competitor may complete a scoring enquiry form available at the race office. If a request for correction is rejected the time limit for requesting redress for the alleged error will run from the time that the rejection is advised to the competitor.
- 18.4 **Series/event tie:** If, after discard, two or more competitors have the same points total the tie will be broken in accordance with RRS Appendix A8.1.

### 19 SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 19.1 Personal Flotation Devices for crew members shall be worn at all times whilst afloat without flag Y having been displayed. This changes RRS 40.
- 19.2 a) A tally system will be used during the event while competitors are afloat. Tallies will be numbered rubber wristbands which should be worn on each competitor's wrist. Individual tally numbers will be allocated at registration.
  - b) Check-out tallies shall be collected from the tally board which will normally be positioned at the top of the launch ramp prior to going afloat or within the clubs premises.
  - c) Check-in tallies should be returned to the tally board immediately on returning to shore after racing, but no later than 30 minutes after the last boat finishing the last race of the day. IT IS THE COMPETITOR'S RESPONSIBILITY TO ENSURE THAT THEY HAVE RETURNED THE TALLY.

# FAILURE TO RETURN YOUR TALLY WILL RESULT IN A £5 DONATION TO RNLI.

19.3 When the race committee considers that a boat or competitor is in difficulty, it may instruct the boat or competitor to accept outside help, retire or sail ashore.

19.4 In accordance with RRS 43.1 and WS Case 89, no clothing or equipment may be worn on the body of helm or crew to carry liquid of any description, even if for the purpose of rehydration; this includes camelbacks, water bottles and cans of drink.

### 20 REPLACEMENT OF CREW OR EQUIPMENT

20.1 **Distinguishing Numbers.** Under exceptional circumstances, the Race Committee may permit a boat to use sails carrying a distinguishing number other than that required by RRS77 and RRS Appendix G. Such permission is only valid if sought in writing and granted at least 2 hours before the advertised start of that day's racing.

### 21 EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

- 21.1 A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rules and sailing instructions.
- 21.2 Class Conformity: Every boat shall comply with the current relevant class rules. Failure to do so may result in disqualification without a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1. and A5.

### 22 ADVERTISING

- 22.1 Boats shall display advertising supplied by the organising authority as specified in the NOR.
- 22.2 When provided at registration, competitors shall make every reasonable effort to display event sponsors promotional items on their boat and sails as directed. If sponsor promotional items come off whilst racing, competitors must obtain replacement items from the RS Association before the start of racing the following day, if the Association has sufficient stocks available.
- 22.3 There will be no restriction on the number or coverage of advertisers logos or slogans except for the front 20% of the forward part of each side of the hull and the foremost 20% of the mainsail boom bottom, which are reserved for RS Association event sponsors. [see ISAF regulation 20 Advertising Code]
- 22.4 Any individual caught stealing sponsor promotional items, e.g. flags, banners, prizes, etc. shall be the subject of a report by the Race Committee to the Protest Committee requesting action under RRS 69.2(a).

# 23 RADIO COMMUNICATIONS

23.1 A boat shall neither make nor receive radio transmissions, text messages or cellular phone calls while racing except in an emergency or when using equipment provided by the race committee.

### 24 SUPPORT BOATS

- 24.1 Support boats shall be registered with the organising authority and will be required to comply with event support boat regulations.
- 24.2 All support boats shall clearly display the identification supplied by the OA at all times while afloat.
- 24.3 Support persons as defined in the RRS shall stay outside areas where boats are racing from the time of the starting sequence until all boats have finished or the race committee signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment.

### 25 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- 25.1 The race organisers shall not be responsible for any loss, damage, death or personal injury howsoever caused to the owner/competitor, his skipper or crew as a result of their taking part in the race or races. Moreover, every owner/competitor warrants the suitability of his boat for the race or races.
- 25.2 The safety of a boat and her entire management including insurance shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/competitor racing the boat, who shall ensure that the boat is fully found, thoroughly seaworthy and manned by a crew sufficient in number and experience who are physically fit to face bad weather. The owner/competitor shall be satisfied as to the soundness of the hull, spars, rigging, sails and all gear. He shall ensure that all safety equipment is properly maintained, stowed and in date and that all crew know where it is kept and how it is to be used.
- 25.3 Neither the establishment of these Sailing Instructions nor any inspection of the boat under these conditions in any way limits or reduces the absolute responsibility of the owner/competitor for his crew, the boat and the management thereof. The crews are nonetheless advised to satisfy themselves as to the experience of the skipper and the adequacy of all safety equipment and insurance arrangements.

### 26 TRASH DISPOSAL

26.1 Boats shall not drop trash in the dinghy park.

# 27 INSURANCE

27.1 Each participating boat shall be adequately insured with valid third-party liability insurance.

### 28 RIGHTS TO USE NAME AND LIKENESS

28.1 By participating in this event, competitors automatically grant to the organizing authority and the event sponsors the right, in perpetuity, to make, use, and show, at their discretion, any photography, audio and video recordings, and other reproductions of them made at the venue or on the water from the time of their arrival at the venue, until their final departure, without compensation.

### 29 PRIZES


- 29.1 The prizes are allocated as follows:
  - a) Top 6 places overall
  - b) Silver Fleet (1st helm)
  - c) Master Helm (1st helm 50 years old or over outside the main prizes per 29.1.a)
  - d) Apprentice (1st helm competing at their first RS300 Nationals)
  - e) Lightweight (less than 75kg, replaces A Rig prize)
  - f) Fidelis Trophy (1st helm outside the main prizes per 29.1.a who has competed in at least 3 previous RS300 Nationals)
  - g) Club Trophy (Teams of 3 from each club to be nominated before Race 1, failing this the results at the end of day 1 will be used to form teams).

# 30 USE OF DRONES

30.1 Event drones (UAVs/UASs) may be used in close proximity to obtain media for an event. This may be on land and/or over water. Any material gained from their use can be used by the event team or sponsors for PR and Media purposes.
