NOTICE OF RACE

ORGANISING AUTHORITY

This event will be organised by Bristol Corinthian Yacht Club at Cheddar Watersports in conjunction with the RS Class Association.

The notation '[NP]' in a rule of the notice of race (NoR) means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

1. RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing 2021 - 2024*.
- 1.2 Supplementary Sailing Instructions will be issued for this event.
- 1.3 Racing rules Race Signals AP, 31, 33, 35, 44.1, 60.1(a), 60.1(b), 61.3, 62.1(a), 62.2, A2 A5.1 and A5.2 will be changed. The changes appear, in full, in this notice of race or in the sailing instructions. The sailing instructions may also change other racing rules.

2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

3 COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 The official noticeboard is located inside the main entrance to the BCYC clubhouse on the right-hand side.
- 3.2 [DP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 The event is open to boats of the RS200, RS400 and RS500 classes.
- 4.2 The helm must be a full, honorary, family, youth or block member of the RS Class Association and crew must be a full, honorary, family, youth, block or crew member of the RS Class Association, except where the helm has a valid 'any crew extension' to their membership.
- 4.3 Eligible boats may enter by completing the online form [here](#)

- 4.4 To be considered an entry at an event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.
- 4.5 Any competitors aged under 18 shall complete an [Under 18s Consent Form](#). This can be downloaded from the RS Class Association websites and should be completed and handed in at registration.
- 4.6 The closing date for online entries is midnight on Wednesday 10th April. Late entries will be accepted on the day at the discretion of the Organising Committee, subject to the payment of a late entry surcharge of £10.
- 4.7 The Organising Authority may cancel the event, cancel classes and reject or cancel entries in its absolute discretion, subject to RRS 76.
- 4.8 Should the Organising Authority reject an entry they shall refund the entry fee in full.
- 4.9 Should the Organising Authority cancel the event within 36 hours prior to the scheduled start of race 1 any refunds will be at the sole discretion of the Organising Authority.

9.2 Five races per day are scheduled. The race target time will be 30 minutes.

9.3 No warning signal will be made after 1700 hours each day.

10 EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

Boats may be inspected at any time.

11 CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT

RRS 40.1 shall apply at all times while afloat.

12 VENUE

The Sailing Area will be Cheddar Reservoir. There is a 10-mph speed limit on the access road on the crest of the reservoir and drivers are asked to comply with this speed.

13 COURSES

The courses to be sailed will be Windward Leeward.

14 SCORING

14.1 Two races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

14.2 When fewer than four races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. This changes RRS A2.

14.3 When from four to seven races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score. This changes RRS A2.

14.4 When from eight to ten races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores. This changes RRS A2.

15 [DP] [NP] SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS

15.1 No support vessels will be permitted at this event.

16 CHARTERED OR LOANED BOATS

Does not apply.

17 HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

Does not apply.

18 DIVING EQUIPMENT AND PLASTIC POOLS

Does not apply.

19 DATA PROTECTION

The Data Processing Policy is available on the class website.

20 RISK STATEMENT

20.1 RRS 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone".

Sailing by its nature is an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- (d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- (e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- (f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
- (g) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules or information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.

21 INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3,000,000 Pounds Sterling per incident or the equivalent.

22 PRIZES

Prizes may be awarded, dependant on entries and at the discretion of the Race Committee, in each class as follows:
