RS 300 Open Meeting

Notice of Race

Saturday 9th March and Sunday 10th March 2024

1. Rules

1.1 Races will be governed by the 'Rules' as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2021 – 2024 except as they are changed by the Bowmoor Sailing Club sailing instructions, the prescriptions of the RYA and this Notice of Race.

2. Condition of Entry

2.1 The regatta is open to all boats of the RS 300 class. Eligible boats may enter by completing an entry form.

2.2 The safety of the boat and its entire management, including insurance shall be the sole responsibility of the competitor(s) racing the boat.

2.3 All craft on the club premises (on land and on the water) must have full insurance cover, including third party liability to £2,000,000.

2.4 The race organisers shall not be liable for any loss, damage, death or personal injury howsoever caused to the owner/competitor, his skipper or crew, as a result of their taking part in the race or races. Moreover, every owner/competitor warrants the suitability of his boat for the race or races.

2.5 To prevent the spread of non-native species boats and trolleys should be cleaned prior to arrival. Check Clean Dry: <http://www.nonnativespecies.org/checkcleandry/index.cfm>.

3. Organising Authority

3.1 The organising authority is Bowmoor Sailing Club.

4. Safety Regulations

4.1 All competitors shall wear adequate personal buoyancy at all times whilst afloat. (Bowmoor SC SI 2.7)

5. Entry and Registration

5.1 To enter the 2024 Bowmoor RS 300 open meeting, you must use the following link to be able to participate.

5.2 Entry fee is payable at online registration.

5.3 Eligible boats may enter by completing an online entry form with the organising authority prior to the event. Online entry will close on March 5th at midnight, late entries will need to contact the club directly to enter. Late entries will also need to pay an additional fee of £10.

6. Event and Programme

6.1 Sailing instructions will be available at entry registration on the day of the event and are posted on the club's notice board in clubhouse. A copy can also be found on the Bowmoor website. (refer to 'Racing' page)

6.2 Hot and cold food and drinks will be available. The entry fee includes: Lunch on Saturday and a breakfast bap on Sunday. Meat and veggie options will be available for lunch.

6.3 Entry registration will commence from 10:00.am on Saturday.

6.4 There will be a briefing for all competitors at 11:30 am on Saturday.

6.5 It is intended to hold at least 6 races. The earliest signal will be at 12:00 on Saturday 9th March and 10:30 on Sunday 10th March. We will aim to hold 4 on Saturday afternoon and 2 races on Sunday morning. On Sunday 10th March, no signal will be made after 12:00.

6.6 The race starting sequence shall be as defined in the Bowmoor 'Sailing Instructions for Open Meetings' instruction 6.1

7. Advertising and Sponsorship

7.1 Advertising will be restricted to Category C.

8. The Course

8.1 The courses will be set on Bowmoor Sailing Club water at Coln Park Lake. For directions to the club refer to the club's website at www.bowmoor.com.

9. Scoring

9.1 Points

The low point scoring system will apply as set out in RRS A4.1. Boats that did not start, did not finish, retired after finishing or were disqualified shall be scored in accordance with RRS A4.2.

9.2 Series Ties

RRS rule A8 applies.

9.3 Individual Scoring

Boats will be placed in order of their combined points. If 3 or more races are sailed, the worst score will be discarded.
